A short time later, the Officer arrived and made contact with loss prevention and the caller. Upon speaking with them, he advised the Officer that a male and female had entered the store at approximately 1544 hrs and made their way to the area of the AC units. The male then selected two ac units and the female selected one, placing them into the cart. They then proceeded to the self checkouts. Once at the checkouts, the male purchased a Reese's and failed to scan and pay for the AC units. They then walked out of the store passing

An Officer arrived on scene and observed a black Ford Escape in the right lane of travel with heavy front end damage. For those who are not vaccinated, a mask covering the nose and mouth is required while in the Library. Patrons who do not have a mask will be offered one. Patrons who cannot wear a mask will be able to access library materials via no-contact Curbside Delivery but must leave the building.


