Ms. Saputra, an 18-year-old high


school student from Schaumburg, Illinois, will perform the first movement of William Walton’s Violin Concerto.

On Tuesday, 4/19, we hosted the Jackson High School track and field team in less than ideal weather conditions (mid 40s with 20 mph winds). Again, our depth and mindset helped us come away with a victory. The final score was Chelsea 90 Jackson 46. Chelsea was able

to score a number of big points on Jackson, specifically in the field events (a number of 1st through 3rd place finishes) and distance events which Chelsea swept. A couple of individual highlights: Makayla Kegerreis was able to earn three first place finishes, specifically in the long jump,

100m dash, and the 200m dash. Also, Makayla was 2nd in the 400m dash. Ava Woodard was first in the discus throw (with a personal record of 101'0") and second in the shot put. Our next meet is Tuesday, April 26th, at home against Adrian.

On Tuesday (April 26th), the Chelsea Girls Track & Field Team hosted a dual meet with Adrian High School at home on a windy, cold afternoon. The final

score Chelsea 97 Adrian 32. We were not full strength as a squad, but many athletes stepped up and did their best in the cold and windy conditions. Chelsea had 14

first place finish. Also, Trilian Krug had a season best time of 5:38.09 in the 1600m, while Madison Morgan placed first in the 800m run (a new PR - 2:39.57) by out leaning an Adrian competitor at the finish line. Next up is the Freshmen/Sophomore Saline Invitational on Thursday (4/28) and Bulldog Invitational at Mason High School on Friday (4/29).

 author, I was completely lost in the story. The writer in me was very impressed by the playwright's ability to make commentary about the world today through a play based in England, 1905. It is a skill I've always admired in authors, typically Dystopian stories. Marie Chartier's discussion of war and how it lines the pockets of men who will never have to fight and how it's impossible to distinguish the side of the war the corpses were on, felt a little painful and accurate today. . But with an honest and accurate view of the world, I did not feel simply doom. The writing and acting were so good, I still smiled and laughed about the tension between Edison and Tesla. My imagination was captivated by the idea of a ghost phone and death ray. I thought the inventions were simply tools of a creative writer to com-

plete the story. Imagine my surprise when my son straight faced swore that Edison invented a spirit phone and that Tesla claimed to invent a death ray. I consulted google and much to my surprise, Forbes published an interview with Edison in Oct of 1920 discussing Edison's invention of a spirit phone to allow the living to communicate with the dead. As expressed by the play, Edison had no desire to utilize the occult, mystics, or mediums. His desire was to utilize scientific methods. A death ray stolen from Tesla, who believed he was creating a device to bring peace. The wise and cynical Marie noted that no weapon ever brings peace. I shivered and thought about the arms race of the 1980s and the war in the Ukraine today. Before I knew it the brilliant Holmes had solved the mystery and the play was over with a less than tidy conclu-

sion, my favorite kind of love story because love stories are never tidy unless they're on the Hallmark channel. The city of Chelsea was well represented, as Thomas Edison was played by Chelsea resident David Bendena and Caitlin Cavanaugh of Chelsea played the devious but brilliant Marie Chartier. The play is well written, the cast, stage and costume are excellent. It would be a shame to miss such a treasure. Do not miss the opportunity to watch the world premiere in your hometown. The Purple Rose will present Sherlock Holmes through Saturday August 27th. The Purple Rose requires masks and proof of vaccine for entry.
