# Allen Park State of the City

#### From: Gail McLeod **PURPOSE**

..., since we have residents, I am going to give a brief summary of where we were, what we've achieved, and

#### where we are headed. **HISTORY**

In the fall of 2012, Allen Park was in financial trouble. A downturn in the economy, decisions made without consideration of budgetary restraints, and an ill-advised buy-in into a highly touted project placed us under State supervision. Unfortunately, staffing was reduced in many departments and everyone's wages were cut. For the next 4-1/2 years, decisions were made for us or had to be approved by the State. On January 27, 2017, we were finally deemed fit to conduct business as a City. There were a lot of hard lessons learned from this experience.

#### **FINANCE**

In November of 2005, the City had a bond rating of A with a stable outlook,. .... In 2015, our bond rating hit a low of CCC+, impacting our ability to borrow at reasonable rates.

Other factors which had, and still have, a negative impact on all of us is the decline in revenue received from property taxes and a

seen an influx of new value of our property was \$1,037,125,624. In 2023, the taxable value of our property is \$939,280,114. ... a steady decline in taxable value starting in 2008; and in 2016, our taxable value hit a low of \$720,219,319. article in the second quarter Allen Park Today magazine gives an overview about what we collect in property taxes

and what we get to keep. As of June 30, 2008 we had total revenue of over \$23,000,000 and expenses of over \$22,000,000 leaving us with general funds of over \$1,600,000. As of June 30, 2022, our total revenue was over \$24,000,000 and expenditures were over \$23,800,000 leaving us with general funds of \$317,529, more than \$1,295,000 less than 14 years ago. Despite rising costs and the fact that today's dollars do not go as far as they used to, our City has managed to progress and improve.

This Council and the preceding council have worked hard to ensure that we are employing qualified individuals to provide services to our community while equipping them with the tools and technology to provide those services, all while being mindful of the revenue at our disposal. We continue to review equipment and resources every budget year, updating our five-year plan, and planning ahead for major and routine capital improvements.

Allen Park has always been resilient. With good management and the ability to make tough decisions, we can continue to grow

and prosper by working together. It takes teamwork to keep us on the right path. Our team is focused on the needs of our community; realizes our financial limitations and is able to prioritize spending for the benefit of both our employees and our community. It is our responsibility and the responsibility of those who succeed us to understand that, at times, we may need to make some difficult decisions. It is easy to say yes; it is often difficult to say no, but we owe it to our residents, our employees, and our retirees to make the right decisions for the right reasons.

As Mayor Council we work to ensure Allen Park remains financially stable. We are mindful, however, that this could change. It would not take much to find ourselves in financial distress if we do not continue to be fiscally responsible and live within our means. We have a balanced budget with appropriate reserves. Our current bond rating is A+ - the highest it has ever been.
