INCIDENT:  
On 12/27/2021, an Officer responded to 3100 Fairlane (Target) on a report of retail fraud. Dispatch advised a B/M wearing dark clothing attempted to steal a TV. The suspect was last seen running S/B in the parking lot. The Officer advised he was on scene and observed the subject run inside of Barnes & Nobel. Upon arrival, book store employees stated the suspect fled out the cafe doors and was last seen running E/B through the parking lot toward Panera Bread. Witnesses observed the suspect remove his black sweatshirt and was now running with a black / neon green shirt. The Officer made 3112 Fairlane (Panera Bread) and located the suspect in the restroom. The subject was detained (handcuffed dl/tc) and transported back to Target, where he was identified as the person who attempted to steal the TV. The suspect repeatedly gave his name and LEIN showed the name as a listed alias for him, the Officer was able to positively identify him from his MI ID photo. While

seated handcuffed in the rear of unit #9. He began to make a phone call from his pocket. The Officer took the phone, at which time the suspect head butted him. See Ofc supplement report.  
TARGET STATEMENTS:  
Target Loss Prevention states the suspect was seen dragging a 70" TV toward the doors without offering payment. When she confronted him he balled his fist and threatened to hit her. She states her Team Lead then addressed him and was punched in the face. He fled the location on foot, without out the TV when she called 911. Based on the above statements and assault of Ofc., he was advised and placed under arrest. He was transported to APPD where he was uncooperative, stating he would not be fingerprinted. While being placed into a holding cell, he removed his penis and threatened to urinate on the floor he also yelled he had COVID refusing to wear a mask. He was advised that he would face further charges if he did not comply with booking procedures. Once processed, he was placed in cell #5 without further incident.

Offender: Information:  
While the suspect was handcuffed behind his back in the rear of Ofc. patrol vehicle, he attempted to use his cellphone. The other Officer asked the officer to get cellphone from him, because the Officer was standing outside of his patrol car speaking with Target personnel. As the Officer opened the rear door to the patrol car, the suspect had his cellphone in hand and talking to someone. As the Officer attempted to grab it, he quickly switch the phone to his other hand and turned his back away from the Officer to prevent me from getting the phone. As the Officer leaned into the car and reach for the phone, the suspect head-butted him to the right side of his forehead with the back of his head. The Officer quickly pushed his head down toward his knees to prevent from getting head-butted any further. The Officer then grabbed the cellphone from his hand. When he stepped back and attempted to shut the patrol car door, the suspect kicked the door into the Officer. He was able to shut the door and did not sustain any noticeable injuries, but his forehead was a little sore.

On 12/24/2021 at 0218 hours, an Officer was dispatched to the intersection of Maylawn Avenue/Carter Avenue on a report of a 3 car crash with unknown injuries.  
OBSERVATIONS UPON ARRIVAL:  
Upon my arrival, the officer observed a silver 2005 Saturn Vue (Unit 1) with disabling front end damage and front airbag deployment. The vehicle appeared to have ran off the roadway to the right and struck a silver 2018 Ford Focus (Unit 2) that was parked and unoccupied on Maylawn Avenue near the intersection of Carter Avenue facing east. This vehicle was then pushed into a silver 2021 Ford Expedition (Unit 3) that was parked in front of it facing east. The Officer further observed Offender/leaning into the driver seat of Unit 1. As he made contact with the driver, he immediately detected an overwhelming odor of intoxicants emanating from his person and observed his eyes to be extremely bloodshot and watery. When asked how the crash had occurred, stated that he looked down to adjust his radio while driving the vehicle and crashed. His speech was heavily slurred and he failed to maintain his balance as he spoke with me. The Officer asked if he had consumed any alcoholic beverages in recent hours to which he stated that he had drank "a

couple beers" at a bar in the City of Gibraltar approximately one hour prior.  
FIELD SOBRIETY TESTS:  
Based upon my observations, the Officer advised that he would be having him perform a series of field sobriety tests to which he verbally consented. The Officer then advised him to walk toward the front of my patrol vehicle where his steps were staggered and off balance. The results of these field sobriety tests are as follows:  
ENGLISH ALPHABET:  
The Officer asked if he could recite the English alphabet without issue to which he stated "Yes". He was then advised to recite the English alphabet aloud starting at the letter A and ending at the letter Z without singing it. He recited "A, B, C, D, E, F, G, H, I, J, K, L, M, N, O, T, Q, R, S, T, U, V, W, X, Y, M, V". His speech was heavily slurred throughout this and he mumbled several letters.  
COUNTING BACKWARDS:  
The Officer asked if he was able to count backward without difficulty to which he stated "Yes". He was then advised to count backwards aloud starting at the number 90 and stopping at the number 78. He recited "90, 98, 97, 97, 93, 92, 91, 90, 91, 81, 82, 83, 84, 80" before pausing and stopping. His speech was again heavily slurred throughout this and he mumbled majority of the numbers.  
FINGER DEXTERITY TEST:  
The Officer asked if he had any ailments with his hands that would prevent him from being able to perform the demonstrated finger dexterity test to which he stated "No". He failed to properly touch his thumb to fingertips and counted out of sequence.  
PRELIMINARY BREATH TEST

(PBT):  
He was advised of his PBT rights to which he verbally consented to taking a roadside breath test. The result of this test was a .19 at 0225 hours.  
DISPOSITION:  
The Officer advised that he was under arrest (handcuffed, DL/TC) for Operating While Intoxicated (OWI). He was then placed into the rear of the patrol vehicle before being transported to Allen Park PD. Once at Allen Park PD, the Officer read his Chemical Test Rights verbatim from the DI-177 form. He verbally consented to a breath test and a 15 minute observation period was initiated at 0303 hours. The result of this breath test was a .22 at 0325 hours and a .20 at 0328 hours. A copy of the OD-80 form along with DI-177 and Allen Park PD OWI cost sheets was placed with his booking paperwork at the OIC desk. Lieutenant entered the DI-177 into LEIN. Unit 1 was impounded with disabling front end damage by Allen Park PD and towed to impound by City Towing (TT: 840). LEIN confirmed this vehicle as uninsured (EIV=N). Unit 2 was also impounded with disabling rear end damage by Allen Park and towed to impound by City Towing (TT: 841). Unit 3 sustained functional damage to the rear end and did not require a tow. At the time of the report, the suspect showed a valid driver's license with no prior 625 alcohol related offenses. The Officer issued citation #82947 for 1. OWI (BAC .17 or Higher)/ 2. No Insurance. ## City of Allen Park

### Water Billing Changes Effective January 1, 2022

Beginning on January 1<sup>st</sup> the City of Allen Park will be changing from a quarterly billing system for water services to a bi-monthly system. Instead of 4 water bills each year, customers will receive 6 water bills annually.

'Ready to Serve' charges will be adjusted accordingly for 2 months or 1 month.

Below are the 3 water billing cycles and how the timing changes will be rolled out.

#### Cycle 2:

Customer Accounts being billed currently and due 11/15. They will have 1 more quarterly bill that will go out for February 1<sup>st</sup> and current charges apply. They will also be billed again on April 1<sup>st</sup>.

#### Cycle 3:

They will be billed on December 1<sup>st</sup>. This will be their last quarterly bill. And the cycle will be split based on their account numbers:

- Account numbers that begin with 710 to 850 will be added to Cycle 1 and billed again in January 2022.
- This will be a 1 month billing for them. The minimum bill for this will be at \$44.78.
- Account numbers that begin with 600 to 700 will be added to Cycle 2 and billed again in February 2022.
- This will be their 1<sup>st</sup> bi-monthly billing.

#### Cycle 1:

- They will be billed January 1<sup>st</sup>. This will be their last quarterly bill with the current charges. They will begin bi-monthly billing March 1<sup>st</sup>.

The minimum charges currently are at 0-5 units (billed @ 5 units) and will change to 0-4 units (billed @ 4 units).

Current minimum bills are \$69.05. Bi-monthly minimum bills will be \$52.24.



