

This past weekend the St. Frances Cabrini Monarchs travelled to Woodhaven High School to compete in the annual Downriver Classic. Out of the 11 teams there, Cabrini came in 10th place, but it wasn't the score that highlighted the significance of the day. Out of the 19 athletes representing Cabrini, 16 of them earned a Personal Record, with 10 of them swimming their personal best each time they jumped in the pool to race.

To start off the day, the relay of Ella Brash, Kieran Fix, Colin Bonar, and Ralph Kaleniecki earned a 9th place finish in the 200 Medley Relay, with K. Fix and R. Kaleniecki earning personal bests in their leg of the race.

In the last two individual events of the day, 4 Monarchs earned a personal best including: J. Day dropping almost 8 seconds in the 100 Backstroke, along with R. Kaleniecki, K. Fix, and C. Tomsic swimming their personal best in the 100 Breaststroke.

In the very last race of the day, the relay team of P. Farris, C. Bonar, Marin Genaw, and Ch. Russelburg

and Carter Russelburg in the 50 Freestyle, Mia Rossman in the 100 Butterfly with a drop of almost 9 seconds, as well as R. Kaleniecki and Grace Kendziuk in the 100 Freestyle.

The most significant time drops came in Event 8: the 500 Freestyle. Sophomores Jack Fitzgerald and G. Rea both competed in the race, with Fitzgerald dropping 27 seconds and Rea dropping 45 seconds off their lifetime best times. To follow that up, T. Bonar, G. Kendziuk, Mykel Marko, and Connor Tomsic earned a personal record in their leg of the 200 Freestyle Relay.

In the last two individual events of the day, 4 Monarchs earned a personal best including: J. Day dropping almost 8 seconds in the 100 Backstroke, along with R. Kaleniecki, K. Fix, and C. Tomsic swimming their personal best in the 100 Breaststroke.

CG: What are your future plans?

MS: I hope to twirl



at Purdue University and be the girl in black (one of the feature twirlers at Purdue), graduate, and major in dietetics and nutrition to become a registered dietitian. I'd like to eventually give back by teaching future generations to twirl.

CG: Hobbies/Favorite teachers and coaches?

MS: Tammy Albrecht, my main baton coach for the past ten years, and my mom for working with the dance aspects. Also coach Pete, for working with me in gymnastics.

CG: Parents and siblings?

MS: Special awards & accomplishments?

MS: Michigan State NBTA two baton and rhythmic champion, Petite WTA world majorette festival queen and many

MS: Tracy and Nicole Smith, my father and mother respectively, as well as my older brothers Kaleb and Shane and older sister Stephanie.

CG: What does baton twirling and representing team USA mean for you?

MS: "Baton is for me a fundamental part of my life, and without it I would be a dramatically different person. It keeps me busy and focused on achieving a goal. Part of that goal was making it to team USA, and that served as a culmination that I've worked for."

CG: Advice to younger athletes or athletes in general?

MS: I've learned over the years that hard work and practice make anything achievable. The repetition found in practice is fundamental to baton and the way I practice it, building muscle memory that you need in a physical activity like this heavily focused on coordination.

CG: Special awards & accomplishments?

MS: Michigan State NBTA two baton and rhythmic champion, Petite WTA world majorette festival queen and many

smaller awards. I am representing Team USA in three events in the 15-17 age group; solo for the nations cup, strut and artistic twirl for world championship. The compe-

tition is this Summer in August, in Liverpool, England. I qualified for the NBTA to compete at the IBTF world championships. The way I qualified to get into worlds was

through the AYOP competition, specifically in the Artistic Twirl Event.

Congrats to Morgan on making Team USA and all of her accomplishments!
