

Operating Under the Influence of Liquor 02/26/2023 at approximately 0130 hours IMPOUNDED VEHICLE:

- Black 1999 GMC Suburban, MI Plate On the above date and time, An Officer was notified by dispatch of a black GMC Suburban that was traveling s/b Southfield, approaching Roosvelt, that was driving recklessly. Dispatch advised that the caller stated the GMC was all over the roadway and had driven up on the median. The Officer began to search the area, but was unable to locate the vehicle. The Officer approached the area of Ecorse and Pelham and observed a black 1999 GMC Suburban, MI Plate traveling n/b Pelham. The Officer observed the GMC disobey the inoperable traffic signal (no lights/ 4-way stop) and almost strike a vehicle. The GMC then stopped in the middle of the intersection before continuing north on Pelham. The Officer got behind the GMC and continued observing it traveling n/b towards Pinecrest. The Officer observed the GMC in the left travel lane, bouncing back and forth crossing the lane divider multiple times. The Officer activated my emergency lights in an attempt to stop the GMC. The GMC began to pull over and drove over the median at Pinecrest, then stopped in the middle of w/b Pinecrest. The GMC pulled forward and finally came to a stop. The Officer advised dispatch of the traffic stop and made contact with the driver. While speaking with the driver, the Officer could smell the odor of intoxicants emanating from the vehicle. The Officer asked him where he was coming from. He stated that he left his cousin's house in Detroit and was trying to head to his house, which was also in Detroit. While speaking with him, the Officer observed him to be lethargic and unable to speak clearly. The Officer asked him if he knew what city he was in. He stated that he was in Detroit. The Officer advised that he was in Allen Park. The Officer asked if he had consumed any alcohol while at his cousin's house, which he stated he did. The Officer had asked him to exit the vehicle to perform the Standardized Field Sobriety Tests. He exited the vehicle

and the Officer patted him down for any contraband. The Officer escorted to the front of the patrol vehicle and asked him if he had any medical conditions that would prevent him from performing the tests. He stated he did not have any medical conditions. The following tests were performed: H O R I Z O N T A L GAZE NYSTAGMUS: The Officer had him sit on the push bumper of my patrol vehicle and asked if he could see the stimulus (green penlight); He stated he could. The Officer informed on how to complete the test, which he stated that he understood. As the Officer began the test, he checked his eyes to make sure that there was equal pupil size, equal tracking and no resting nystagmus. After the checks, the Officer observed a lack of smooth pursuit, the onset of nystagmus prior to 45 degrees and a distinct and sustained nystagmus at maximum deviation in both eyes (6 clues).

WALK AND TURN: The Officer instructed him to get into the starting position while he explained the test to him and to not start the test until told to do so. He stated he understood. He had a hard time getting into the starting position, stumbling over his feet. He was able to get into the starting position, but almost immediately lost his balance and attempted to start the test. The Officer was able to get him back in the starting position and explained the test to him. He stated he understood the test. The Officer instructed him to start, and he instead stood without moving. He finally began the test, but was unable to maintain his balance by stepping off the line, not walking heel to toe and took an improper amount of steps. Due to being unsteady on his feet, the Officer terminated the test for his safety. ONE LEG STAND: The Officer instructed on how to complete the test. After explaining the test, he stated he understood. The Officer instructed him to begin, but he instead stood still, looking at the Officer. The Officer asked if he had any questions, which he stated that he did not know what to do, even after telling the Officer he understood the test. The Officer explained the test to again, which he

again stated he understood. The Officer instructed him to begin. He raised his right foot and immediately placed it down and had to raise his arms for balance. He tried multiple times to raise his foot, but had to place it down to maintain his balance. The Officer terminated the test for safety. The Officer escorted him to my patrol vehicle and had him sit in the rear of Vehicle #30 so he could warm up. The Officer read his Preliminary Breath Test Rights and asked if he understood them. He stated he understood his rights. The Officer asked if he would be willing to provide a breath sample. He had refused. Due to the Officer's observations of his driving, initial interview and SFSTs, the Officer had probable cause to place under arrest for OUIL. He stated that he would take the PBT. The Officer offered a chance to provide a breath sample, which he did. He provided a breath sample of .215 BAC. The Officer placed him under arrest (TC/DL), and placed him in the rear of Vehicle #30 after searching his person. The Officer notified City Towing to impound the vehicle (TT #91) and Ofc. They stayed on scene until the GMC was impounded; Ofc. also conducted an inventory search of the vehicle. He was transported to the Allen Park Police Department and began the first observation period at 0205 hours. The Officer read his Chemical Test Rights from the DI-177 form; He stated he understood his rights and would be willing to provide a breath sample. The Officer began the booking process and then began the Datamaster test at 0221 hours. He provided a breath sample, but the Datamaster machine stated it was an "invalid sample". He started another 15 minute observation period at 0222 hours. He was then able to provide two breath samples at 0239 hours and 0241 hours of .24 BAC. The Officer was able to finish the booking process without issue. The Officer issued a citation to him for Operating Under the Influence of Liquor. The Officer entered the Datamaster results into LEIN.

While on patrol an Officer observed the above listed vehicle stopped in the center lane of Southfield/Bob Seger Blvd at a green traffic signal. The Officer positioned the patrol vehicle behind the vehicle and activated my emergency lights, the vehicle remained stopped through (3) light cycles before the Officer approached the driver. The Officer advised dispatch that there was a male driver asleep at the wheel and that the driver had his foot on the brake and the vehicle was still in gear. AP55 arrived on scene and positioned his patrol vehicle in front of the offenders vehicle.

Circumstances: The Officer knocked on the drivers window and woke the driver up, at first he took his foot of the brake and

began rolling toward Ofc. patrol vehicle. The Officer gave the driver a verbal command to put the vehicle in "park" and to "turn the vehicle off". The driver complied and the Officer was able to open the driver door once the vehicle was stopped and the Officer ordered the driver to step out of the vehicle. The driver had a strong odor of intoxicants emitting from his person along with blood shot eyes and a glassy stare. The Officer asked the driver if he had been drinking alcohol tonight and he stated "Yes". The Officer advised the driver that he was going to be administering Field Sobriety Test and he agreed to take them. *Prior to Fields the Officer was able to locate the drivers wallet with his MI ID card: Field Sobriety Test- The Officer asked if he could recite his Alphabet from A-Z without singing and he stated "Yes". He performed the test L,M,N,O,H and cited several other letters out of place. The Officer then asked if he could count backwards from 99-82

and he stated "Yes". He performed by counting 89,88,80,82. The Officer then demonstrated the finger dexterity test for and asked if he understood and he stated "Yes". performed the test failing to count out loud as instructed and failed to accurately touch his fingertips. The Officer advised him of his PBT rights and he agreed to take the test with a result of .108. Based on listed statements/ observations the Officer placed him under arrest (DL/TC) for OWI. He was then transported to APPD where he was booked/ processed. Upon arrival at APPD, the Officer read -- his Chemical Breath Test rights verbatim from the DI-177 and he agreed to take the test at 0314hrs. He then took the test with a result of .10 at 0332hrs and .10 at 0335hrs. He was issued copies of his DI-177 form, Datamaster results, and Cost Form. The Officer entered the DI-177 into LEIN. He was issued Cit# for 1)OWI 2)DWLS 3)No Insurance.





Michigan Philharmonic goes “3D” in March

Food drive for ‘Orchestras Feeding America’ also planned

Get ready to travel through three musical dimensions as the Michigan Philharmonic offers up a fascinating range of unique styles and sounds during its next live performance in March.

The Philharmonic’s magical “Music in 3D” concert is on Sunday, March 19 at 2 p.m. in Plymouth’s First United Methodist Church. Led by Conductor and Music Director Nan Washburn, now in her 24th season, the performance features Antonin Dvořák, a European master of rhythm and folk music; modern, innovative music from rising Chinese composer Dai Wei; and a legendary female French composer Germaine Tailleferre, whose concertino for harp will showcase Philharmonic harpist Maurice Draughn.

Three pieces will be featured, including Wei’s “Invisible Portals” (2022), Germaine Tailleferre’s “Concertino for Harp and Orchestra” (1927) and Dvořák’s “Symphony No. 7 in D Minor Op. 70” (1885).

As a part of the concert, the Philharmonic is participating in the “Orchestras

Feeding America” food drive organized by the League of American Orchestras. Partnering with Gleaners and Feeding America, the Phil is asking for audience members to bring canned or other non-perishable food and donate in the boxes that will be provided.

There will also be a pre-concert talk beginning at 1:15 p.m. with Washburn and composer Dai Wei who will speak about her piece.

Originally from China, Wei’s musical journey navigates in the spaces between east and west, classical and pop, electronic and acoustic, innovation and tradition. She often draws from eastern philosophy and aesthetics and is nourished by the Asian and Chinese Ethnic cultures in many different ways. She was awarded CANOA Commission (Composing a New Orchestra Audience) from the American Composer Orchestra Underwood New Music Reading, and her newly composed chamber orchestra Invisible Portals premiered at Carnegie Hall in 2022.

During a centralized quarantine, she wrote a piece for solo

sician. He has appeared as a soloist with several orchestras including the International Symphony, Rochester Symphony, Michigan Philharmonic and the Detroit Symphony Civic Orchestra. He is currently a freelance harpist performing with several orchestras and ensembles throughout Southeastern Michigan and Western Ontario including the Detroit Symphony Orchestra and the Michigan Op-

era Theatre.


