



## ON THE SIDELINE: SUPER BOWL, LIONS, DEFENSE AND PASS RUSHERS

It's been a few weeks since Super Bowl LVI was played at SoFi Stadium in Los Angeles. The Los Angeles Rams defeated the Cincinnati Bengals 23-20 to capture the NFL championship.

Matthew Stafford was the winning quarterback for the Rams. Stafford finished the game 26-of-40 passing for 283 yards and three touchdowns, with two interceptions. This past season was Stafford's

first with Los Angeles. Previously, for the last 12 years, Stafford had been the starting quarterback for the Detroit Lions. In his 12 years with the Lions, Stafford had never won a playoff game. In one season with the Rams, Stafford not only won multiple playoff games, he captured the biggest prize of them all, a Super Bowl title.

I have to chuckle. Of course, right? Stafford's immediate success in Los Angeles shows just how incompetent Detroit's team leadership had been throughout Stafford's tenure with the Lions. How can Stafford barely sniff the playoffs in his 12 years in Detroit and in one season with the Rams win the Super Bowl? It's crazy.

Only the Lions. I guess, at least in my humble opinion, what Stafford's success in LA proved is that defense does indeed win championships. The Rams' defense is strong at every level, especially up front. Stafford wasn't the sole reason LA won the Super Bowl, he was simply the team's missing piece. In Detroit, Stafford and the offense seemingly had to score 40 points or more a game to have a chance to win since the Lions' defense was always so porous. In LA, Stafford's offense could score 20 points or so and still win. In Detroit, that rarely seemed to happen for Stafford.

I don't know, I've just always been a proponent of building a

strong defense first and foremost. I do believe the tired and overused football line of "defense wins championships." I just do. And sadly the Lions for the longest time have neglected building a stout defense. Detroit has drafted poorly defensively over the years and has paid big money for high-priced defensive free agents that have more often than not been duds in a Lions uniform. It's frustrating as a life-long Lions fan to consistently watch Detroit neglect the defensive side of the football.

The Lions have two first round picks in April's NFL draft and five selections in the opening three rounds. I would love to see Detroit use all five picks on the defensive

side of the football. The Lions have the No. 2 overall pick in the first round. Here's hoping Detroit selects Michigan defensive end Aidan Hutchison. Hutchison (6-foot-6, 280 pounds) is a JJ Watt/Joey Bosa-type talent as an edge rusher potentially. More than anything, in my opinion, the Lions need pass rushers and Hutchison fits that bill nicely.

I truly think Detroit should use all five of its picks in the first three rounds on front seven-type defensive players. The Lions drafted three front-seven guys in last year's draft and each player saw action a season ago and figures significantly in Detroit's future defensive plans. I want

youth, energy and speed off the edge and up the middle in pass rush situations. In all my years as a Lions fan, I've never seen Detroit's defense have a consistent and ferocious pass rush. It would be nice if the Lions could continue building their front seven and their pass rush with this year's draft.

I guess a guy can dream, right?

Hey, Matthew Stafford dreamed of winning a Super Bowl and it came true.

Why can't I dream of Detroit having the best pass rush and strongest defense in the NFL?

Don't laugh. It could happen. It really could. Stop laughing...



Last week the Cabrini Monarchs Swim and Dive team finished up their regular season by competing in two dual meets against Cranbrook Kingswood High School on Tuesday, 2/15/2022, and then Allen Park High School on Saturday, 2/19/2022. Both opposing teams offered up great talent and fierce competition, and while the Monarchs may not have won those meets, they

still performed well and had significant improvements in their races.

First against Cranbrook, the Monarchs earned 22 Personal Records and 1 Season Record. In the Medley Relay 6 athletes from Cabrini earned Personal Records in their leg of the race; including Tyler Noah who dropped 7 seconds, Jenny Day, Giovanni Rea, and Ralph Kaleniecki dropping 3 seconds each, as well as

Chris Russelburg and Joseph Berro each dropping a second. Next, in the 200 Individual Medley, Senior Lily Heath dropped 4 seconds from her best time. In the next 4 individual events, 6 Monarchs earned personal best times; including Rea dropping 5 seconds and Day dropping 3 seconds in the 50 Freestyle, Drew Bylow dropping a second in the 100 Butterfly, both Noah and Mia Rossman

dropping 6 seconds in the 100 Freestyle, and again Day dropping a whopping 25 seconds in the 500 Freestyle! To finish up the night of competition, Marin Genaw and Noah both dropped a second in their leg of the 200 Freestyle Relay, Berro dropped 2 seconds in the 100 Breaststroke, as well as Bylow, Taylor Bonar, Cassidy Glazier, and Day dropping time in their leg of the 400 Freestyle Relay, with Bonar dropping an in-

credible 10 seconds in her split!
