





Just after 4pm on April 10, 2023, Dearborn Heights Police Officers attempted to stop a stolen vehicle on eastbound Michigan Avenue near Outer Drive. During the attempt, the operator of the stolen vehicle attempted to flee police officers who were driving ful-Dearborn ly-marked Heights police vehicles.

onto Oakwood Blvd ta. and struck two other motorists in the City of Dearborn - both of whom sustained non-life-threatening injuries.

Police Officers arrested five (5) suspects who were inside the stolen vehicle. Two (2) were transported to an area hospital with suspected non-life-threatening injuries. Officers recovered a loaded 9mm handgun with an extended magazine (see photo) and a Taser from the suspects' stolen vehicle. The suspects are 15-18 years old and reside in Michigan and North Dako-

Police Chief Jerrod S. Hart stated "Like many communities, we are experiencing a spike in motor vehicle thefts and our residents are understandably frustrated. The thefts negatively impact our residents' quality of life and ability to earn a living." Chief Hart continued "I would like to thank the women and men of Dearborn Police and Fire Departments for their assistance in this incident. Law enforcement is a team effort with criminals crossing jurisdictional lines to prey on our community members."






