



I don't know what his secret is, but a part of me kinda wants to remain injured so my lawn can continue looking so nice. I'm kidding — sort of. He's a U-M fan and I'm an MSU guy. Who says Wolverines and Spartans can't get along? Thanks, so much, Ted. I owe you.

To my immediate family, thank you. My goodness, I haven't seen my family this much since we all lived together in the same house when we were younger. Almost every week someone from my family has visited to keep me company and bring groceries or
