continued from page 1 has been awarded a minigrant of \$2,750 from the State of Michigan Council for Arts and Cultural Affairs (MCACA). CAFE is one of six organizations that received grants in the final round of

funding for Region 9 that includes Hillsdale, Jackson, Livingston, Lenawee and Washtenaw counties. Creative Washtenaw administers this program on behalf of MCACA.

Crystal Scott, Visual Arts Coordinator

for CAFE commented "This grant is important and will assist CAFE in the management and oversight of the exhibition. We are continuously seeking ways to enhance visitors' enjoyment of SculptureWalk Chelsea."

CAFE recently invested in larger, more visible plaques at each of the sculptures.

This annual outdoor exhibition will be celebrating its 12th anniversary. Fourteen juried sculptures, the majority created by Michigan Artists continue to be showcased throughout historic downtown Chelsea. Each exhibiting Artist receives a stipend of \$850, an increase from the previous year.

The exhibition has a history of strong community partnership and support. A recent example is the purchase of a sculpture, one of two that have been on display at the Chelsea District Library. "The Chelsea District Library is pleased to add the metal sculpture, Elk Bugling, to its art collection. This intriguing

acquisition created with a wide variety of found objects will continue to invigorate the public space surrounding the library and embody the library's mission to engage and inspire the community. It is sure to delight visitors for years to come!" commented Lori Coryell, Library Director.

Artist Kyle Burnett, from Battle Creek, was inspired by the Elk in Northern Michigan in creating Elk Bugling with recycled metals.

Community support also comes in the form of sponsorships; each of the 14 sculptures is financially sponsored by local businesses. The City of Chelsea has provided financial assistance and support with the installation and removal of the sculptures in this rotating annual exhibit.

Craig Common, President of CAFE shared his appreciation, "We are thankful for MCACA's confidence and ongoing support of this visual art project that has become an integral part of the visual and cultural arts community in Chelsea."

SculptureWalk is free for all visitors and community residents. The sculptures are available for purchase, with most of the proceeds going to the Artist and the balance reinvested into the program. This outdoor exhibition has been especially appreciated during this past year. # Washtenaw County Health Department Opens Additional COVID-19 Vaccination Site

*Chelsea site opens in partnership with St. Joseph Mercy Chelsea and Chelsea School District*

Washtenaw County Health Department is adding a second mass vaccination location on the western side of the county. The Pierce Lake Elementary School site opens Tues., March 9 in collaboration with St. Joseph Mercy Chelsea hospital and Chelsea School District. The new site will provide approximately 324 vaccinations per day and add additional days as supplies allow.

Pierce Lake Elementary School is located at 275 N. Freer Road, Chelsea, Mich., 48118 and is not currently in use as a school building. Individuals eligible for vaccination under state prioritization guidelines can request an appointment online or by calling the Health Department at 734-544-6700 or contacting 211.

"We continue to use all of our resources to make sure we give available vaccine as quickly as possible," says Jimena Loveluck, MSW, health officer with Washtenaw County Health Department. "We remain grateful for the support of our partners and the patience of our community members. Our vaccine supplies are increasing, and we look forward to vaccinating everyone who is ready to be vaccinated as soon as possible."

Mass vaccination, or bringing large numbers of people to a central location, is one of several emergency vaccination strategies in use in Washtenaw County. Additional strategies include mobile vaccination (Nurse on the Run), targeted community vaccination sites (pop-ups), coordination with health care providers, and pharmacies.

St. Joseph Mercy Chelsea hospital has been providing COVID-19 vaccination to eligible western Washtenaw

County residents and will continue to do so in the short term. Eventually, the hospital will transition their operations fully to support the Pierce Lake Elementary site as it ramps up.

"We are pleased to be working with the Washtenaw County Health Department and the Chelsea School District to offer additional vaccination opportunities to our community," said Cheryl Taylor, RN, MSN, Chief Nursing Officer, St. Joseph Mercy Chelsea. "A mass vaccination site in western Washtenaw County will enable more residents to be vaccinated closer to home as vaccine supply allows."

The Chelsea School District is providing use of the Pierce Lake Elementary School building. "We are happy to collaborate with the Washtenaw County Health Department and St. Joseph Mercy Chelsea to provide a site in western Washtenaw County for our community to receive their vaccines," said Superintendent, Dr. Julie Helber.

**COVID-19 Vaccine Eligibility**  
Starting today (Monday, March 8), the following groups are now eligible and may request a COVID-19 vaccine appointment:

- Those 50 years or older with medical conditions or disabilities (see a list of qualifying medical conditions or disabilities on pages 11-12 of this document.)

- Caregiver family members or guardians age 16 or older of children who have special health care needs.

Individuals who are eligible starting today will likely have to wait several weeks or more, depending on supplies, before an appointment is available. **The link to request an appointment is here. The**

**request survey asks individuals to attest to qualifying health conditions or disabilities.**

If you need help completing an appointment request by phone, call 734-544-6700 and leave a message or call 211. Within this newly eligible group, the Health Department will start by prioritizing those who are 60 years old or older.

On Monday, March 22, everyone 50 years old or older will be eligible for vaccine. We will share more about the vaccine request process for this group in the coming weeks.

The Health Department continues to vaccinate those who live or work in Washtenaw County. Identification with a birthdate or documentation of employment is acceptable proof.

**Different COVID-19 Vaccines**

Washtenaw County Health Department cannot offer community members their choice among available vaccines but will provide information about which vaccine is available to individuals at time of appointment (Pfizer, Moderna, or Janssen (Johnson & Johnson)). Washtenaw County Health Department recommends all available COVID-19 vaccines and encourages everyone to get vaccinated when it is their turn.

on the ground before being admitted to the hospital.

# MDARD, MI Agricultural Preservation Fund Board Award \$1.8 million to Local Farmland Preservation Programs

Michigan Department of Agriculture and Rural Development (MDARD) Director Gary McDowell, along with the Michigan Agricultural

Preservation Fund Board (APFB), has awarded \$1.8 million in agricultural preservation fund grants to seven local farmland preservation programs to close on

permanent agricultural conservation easements.

The state's Farmland Preservation Local Grants Program provides funding to local farmland preservation programs that are qualified to close on permanent agricultural conservation easements. Twenty-four local programs were eligible to submit grants for funding. Farm preservation ensures communities have locally sourced fresh food and agricultural jobs.

"Ensuring the long-term sustainability of Michigan's nearly 10 million acres of farmland is the foundation for preserving our food production and supply," said McDowell. "These grants assist local preservation programs in purchasing development rights to preserve important farmland

in their communities thereby protecting farmland for future generations."

The following local farmland preservation programs received grants preserving 730 acres:

- Scio Township (Washtenaw County) - \$825,000
- Ottawa County - \$157,500
- Kent County - \$201,294
- Webster Township (Washtenaw County) - \$200,000
- Washtenaw County - \$244,800
- Eaton County - \$46,725
- Barry County - \$130,000

The fund will distribute \$1.8 million in grants covering up to 75 percent of the costs for purchasing the development rights on agricultural land. It also helps pay for some of the closing costs associated with the conservation

easements.

The APFB consists of seven members including the MDARD Director (or his/her designee) and the director of the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (or his/her designee). It was established through legislation in 2000 to award grants to local agricultural conservation easement programs.

To qualify, a county or township must have zoning authority, covered under a master plan that includes

farmland preservation, passed a Purchase of Development Rights Ordinance, and created a plan for monitoring conservation easements. Local programs are selected based on the scoring system adopted by the board, that focuses on quality agricultural parcels and program achievements.

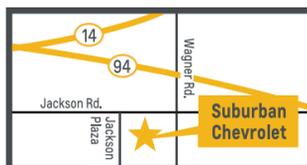

Bram Hartsuff finished fourth in the 200 IM (2:34.71), while the Bulldogs finished second, third, and fourth in the 50 freestyle. Levine took second (26.74), Zachrich placed third (27.90) and Joel Burke touched fourth (28.60). Hanna placed fourth in the diving event (132.55

points), while Burke finished runner-up in the 100 freestyle (1:01.25). Zachrich's 100 backstroke was quick enough for third place (1:14.33), while fellow senior Hanna finished runner-up in the 100 breaststroke (1:22.44).

The Bulldogs will next hit the pool on Friday, March 12 and Saturday, March 13 for the SEC White Division championship meet at Dexter. Diving will take place on Friday afternoon, with swim finals on Saturday afternoon. There will be no spectators on Saturday, but the meet will be live streamed by the host Dexter.

The Washtenaw United Girls HS Ice Hockey team travelled to Grand Rapids Sunday for a rematch against the Grand Rapids Griffins 19U team. It was a sunny day for travel, but the team struggled for several periods trying to ensure a happy drive home.

Grand Rapids recognized their seniors before the game Sunday afternoon. And then the work of trying to score started for both teams. Washtenaw, missing Riley Malloy (Saline '24), juggled their lines and saw excellent defensive play from forwards Linzy Costella (Manchester '21), defenseman Rylee Kennedy (Milan '24) and Cecilia Henrikson (Chelsea '24).
