## Chelsea High Alum Starts Thank You Movement in Chelsea

When Katy Tinsley saw a need to support Chelsea teachers, she jumped into action.

After reading so many articles, letters to the editors, Facebook posts that reflected the growing uneasiness about kids and teachers returning to face to face teaching, Tinsley wanted the teachers, administrators, and support staff to know, 'Hey, we appreciate

you and what you do for Chelsea kids.'

"The idea to write thank you letters came about from seeing people wondering how they could support Chelsea teachers," said Tinsley, a 2007 CHS alum. But she was also inspired by an effort she participated in when she lived in New Orleans.

"A woman — just someone like me — created a Google form to match teachers with those will-

ing to put together a little care package. I was connected with a teacher and dropped a care package at her home with little goodies and a nice note." Little gifts and words of appreciation that made that teacher's week.

Tinsley said they exchanged emails about being thankful, the pandemic, and teaching virtually while sick with Covid.

"Being able to

make that one-on-one connection was so valuable to me. It showed me how easy it was to help someone and it gave me a real life story of how hard teaching has been during the pandemic instead of it just being an abstract struggle."

So when Tinsley saw an opportunity in Chelsea, she immediately thought of her experience in New Orleans.

She first contacted her CHS classmate Alex Stacy, who now teaches at Beach Middle School, to see what he thought would be a good idea.

Stacy took the question back to the union meeting and the response was "literally anything," laughed Tinsley, who is back home in Chelsea for a bit, after working as a wedding planner in Seattle and managing an art market in New Orleans.

"So I figured we'd go for the easiest thing possible to make it happen as fast as possible and that is just sending words of encouragement."

Through the Chelsea Residents in the Know Facebook group, she asked for volunteers to send a short email sending kind words of thanks and support.

With over 450 staff members, it's not an easy task. Right now, Tinsley and her community volunteers are about a quarter of way through the list.

The initial response from Chelsea staff has been inspiring, said Tinsley. She said the volunteers were getting replies that said things like:

"What a wonderful message to begin my zooming today! Thank you for taking the time to send this."

"It is so nice to hear positive comments. Everyone in this district — custodians, bus drivers, food service workers, para-pros, administrators, teachers, maintenance staff, administrative assistants, etc. — has worked so hard and are trying to make the best of things."

"Thank you for the kind words. It is always nice to get a pat on the back!"

"This simple act of kindness during a very complicated school year was not lost on Chelsea," Superintendent Julie Helber.

"We are so thankful to our community and to Katy Tinsley for starting this 'thank you' movement," Helber said. "This has been a very challenging year for

our Chelsea School District staff and to be recognized and thanked means so much to us. Strong communities lift each other up during times of trouble. Thank you for lifting us up!"

For Tinsley, it's been an opportunity to reconnect with her childhood community as an adult. It's not the kind of place she has typically chosen to live, she noted, but through circumstance, she finds herself in Chelsea for a little while...and enjoying it, especially meeting "like-minded folks" with organizations like One World One Family, ARCY, the Chelsea Arts Initiative, and the Intergenerational Garden.

"I've made lots of great connections with other folks and organizations doing the important work that needs to be done in this city, I'm currently trying to be as involved and helpful as possible."



# NATALIE WILL BE A WARRIOR

Chelsea senior Natalie Davies is taking her running skills to Wayne State University in the Fall. She recently signed to be a Warrior.

Natalie will compete in cross country and track. "They have one of the top 5 journalism programs in the state, I want to live in a big city, I talked to many coaches and the Wayne State coach was the one I clicked the most with," Natalie said. "The running program sounded similar to what we did in cross country focusing on tempo runs, and that

program was a good fit for me in cross country."

She has had some interesting running experiences.

"I had a unique experience with cross country... my freshman year, I ran 23 minutes 1 second in the 5k 3 times (the cut off for a varsity letter is 23 minutes). Coach Clarke made an exception because I got that time multiple times," she added. "My sophomore year was my first year running on varsity. At the regional (how to get to states), my shoe fell off in the first 100 meters of the

race, I ran my worst race of the season. My junior year, I ran at the regional with a stress fracture that took me 8 months to heal from (no running without pain for 8 months... did cross training and a little running, but it took way longer for it to heal than normal) ran my worst race of the season in pain (neither year we made it to states). Senior year we won the pre-region, regional, and got 7th in the state. That was definitely the best end to the season I could have hoped for after so much adversity the last few years."

She ran 19 minutes 53 seconds at the Gabriel Richard meet where nearly everyone ran a personal record, and she was the first girl on the team in 2 years to run under 20 minutes. That was her junior year.

"Track season my sophomore year was one of my favorite seasons ever," she said. "I fell in love with running and I got really close to all the runners and made my closest friends."

Her majors at Wayne State will be Journalism and Computer Science. Natalie will live on campus.

Her family includes parents Amy and Jeremy Davies, and siblings Nora and Iris Davies.

She likes being a Bulldog. "I moved here in 8th grade. There have been so many opportunities here," she added.

Her goals are admirable. "I want to improve a lot and enjoy my time running in college," she said. "I want to write for a big newspaper someday

and/or be a programmer for a company that has to do with learning languages and write for them... my options are open, especially with 2 majors. Also, like my dad, I want to coach for kids."

She has had many influences. "I started cross country as a Freshman because Coach Clarke told me I should join in middle school track (my mom is a runner and she thought I would like distances, so that is why I joined middle school track) because I didn't play a fall sport, but I ended up quitting 2 sports I played for most of my life before that (softball and basketball) because

of running," she said. "I stopped playing softball my sophomore year to run track, and I stopped playing basketball my junior year because I had an injury from running and my senior year I ran in the winter instead of playing basketball."

For her many family members, friends, teammates, coaches, and teachers have helped her get to this point. "I couldn't be more thankful for them and the opportunities that I have. Coaches McPherson, Clarke, Swager and Gabrielson have helped me as a runner and person so much," she stated.

# Letter to the Editor

Michigan's 2020 presidential election was by many measures one of the most successful in our state's history. More than 5.5 million votes cast their ballots—the highest number ever in Michigan—and over 3.2 million of them voted by absentee ballot.

Michigan Senate Republicans recently introduced 39 bills with the intent to make it more difficult to vote. Senate Bills 273-311 are part of a large, national effort to limit our constitutional right to vote and to put up massive barriers to make it harder to

vote using an absentee ballot.

A huge majority—nearly 67%—of Michigan voters supported expanding our access to the ballot. Michiganders want to see laws that will make it easier to vote, not harder.

Our Chelsea community and surrounding areas serve a large retirement community, many who use the absentee ballot system because of transportation issues or disabilities that make it difficult for them to travel to the polling areas. I myself often travel at this time of year and

find that some of the restrictions may make it more difficult to vote as well. I voted for the right to expand our voting privileges and to not restrict them. Voting is our fundamental right.

I urge all readers of the Chelsea Guardian to contact your state legislators today and ask them to oppose Senate Bills 273-311. You can also sign up to volunteer at voter-snotpoliticians.com/volunteer.



The Chelsea girl's track and field team competed at the 47th Warrior Invitational held at Grass Lake High School on Saturday, April 10th. Chelsea finished 4th with 112 points out of 7 teams who competed at the invitational with a limited squad. Hanover-Horton placed first with 147 points and Grass Lake was runner up with 121 points. Chelsea collected a number of medals in 10 events. Also, we had a number of personal records (PRs) and season bests. Overall, we showed up ready to compete, but we need to continue to get more into track and field shape and focus more on event specific preparation. This is expected as we move into our third week of competition.

One of many standout performances today was Brooke Matusik who placed 2nd in the 100 m hurdles with a time of 17.85 and was a member of the 4x400 m relay, which finished first with a time of 4:52.83. Senior Kendra Patterson finished 2nd in 300 m hurdles with a time of 53.95. Kendra also led off the 4x200 m relay which placed

first overall with a time of 2:01.97. Lany Smith was critical in the lead offs and anchor legs in the 4x100m (3rd place), 4x200m (1st place), and 4x400m (1st place). 

# Chelsea Education Foundation Opens Scholarship Application Window

The Chelsea Education Foundation (CEF) is accepting scholarship applications through April 30, 2021. CEF offers 15 scholarships to Chelsea High School graduating seniors and/or current college students living within the Chelsea School District.

In 2020, the Foundation awarded over \$29,000 in scholarship monies. Since 1990, over 900 students have received scholarships from CEF to further their educational goals.

Lynn Fox, Chelsea Education Foundation board president, said the organization

has been fortunate to be the recipient of funding for various scholarships.

“Individuals and business owners, who understand the importance of support for Chelsea area students to further their education, have allowed CEF to act as a pass-through to help those students. The endowments established for the CEF-funded scholarships have grown over the 30 years the organization has been in existence. These endowments are important to our ability to provide scholarships.”

Many of the scholarships offered honor Chelsea community members, including the Joseph Piasecki Memorial Scholarship, named for the Chelsea School Dis-

trict superintendent who started the CEF in 1990. The Joel Gentz Memorial Leadership and Service Scholarship is named for Gentz, a 2002 Chelsea High School and Air Force lieutenant who died during a rescue mission.

Other scholarships are career specific. The Chelsea Family Dentistry Scholarship and the Mary Merkel Memorial Nursing Scholarship provide for students pursuing a degree in a healthcare field. The Chelsea Rod and Gun Club Scholarship is aimed towards students interested in hunting, fishing, conservation, shooting sports, or other outdoor related activities. As its name implies, the CEF Engineering, Computer Science, or Accounting Scholarship is open to applicants pursuing a degree in any of those fields.

While many scholarships are geared toward traditional four-year college students, the CEF is pleased to offer awards for those pursuing skilled trade careers or skilled training, such as the Chelsea Education Foundation Academic Scholarship and The Brian McGrath Memorial Scholarship.

Others are de-

signed for the non-traditional student or students already enrolled in a course of study, rather than a newly-minted graduating senior. While other scholarships were set up for applicants who have shown acts of kindness or have participated in community service projects.

The process of applying is easy and Fox encourages applicants to take a look at the Foundation website to see what is available. The deadline is April 30, 2021. And then, the review process be-

“We have a wonderful group of scholarship reviewers who rank each essay,” Fox said.

“I’d say that one never knows what will stand out in an essay that will bring a high ranking score for one essay over another. Those reviewers don’t know whose essay they are reading since all identifying information is redacted.”

She cautions against using the same essay for more than one application, noting that it usually results in a lower rank, because each scholarship has its own specific requirements.

“There is no ‘one size fits all’ when applying.”


