• About 1 in 8 U.S. women (about 13%) will develop invasive breast cancer over the course of her lifetime.

• In 2021, an estimated 281,550 new cases of invasive breast cancer are expected to be diagnosed in women in the U.S., along with 49,290 new cases of non-invasive (in situ) breast cancer.

• About 2,650 new cases of invasive breast cancer are expected to be diagnosed in men in 2021. A man's lifetime risk of breast cancer is about 1 in 833.

• About 43,600 women in the U.S. are expected to die in 2021 from breast cancer. Death rates have been steady in women under 50 since 2007, but have continued to drop

in women over 50. The overall death rate from breast cancer decreased by 1% per year from 2013 to 2018. These decreases are thought to be the result of treatment advances and earlier detection through screening.

• For women in the U.S., breast cancer death rates are higher than those for any other cancer, besides lung cancer.

• As of January 2021, there are more than 3.8 million women with a history of breast cancer in the U.S. This includes women currently being treated and women who have finished treatment.

• Breast cancer is the most commonly diagnosed cancer among American women. In 2021, it's estimated that

about 30% of newly diagnosed cancers in women will be breast cancers.

• Breast cancer became the most common cancer globally as of 2021, accounting for 12% of all new annual cancer cases worldwide, according to the World Health Organization.

• In women under 45, breast cancer is more common in Black women than white women. Overall, Black women are more likely to die of breast cancer. For Asian, Hispanic, and Native-American women, the risk of developing and dying from breast cancer is lower.

Ashkenazi Jewish women have a higher risk of breast cancer because of a higher rate of BRCA mutations.

## Healthy Family Day A success at Dexter Farmers Market



The Dexter Wellness Coalition with a grant from 5 Healthy Towns Foundation recently funded a new community event for pre-school child wellness, called Moving Dexter Families Toward a Healthy Path. The purpose of this event was to promote physical activity, healthy eating and increase familiarity with the Dexter Farmers Market, as well as to encourage families to connect with others in the community in healthy ways.

According to World Health Organization, the two most important means of preventing childhood obesity are physical activity and healthy food choices. Dexter Wellness Coalition promotes these activities across the

life span, but recently teamed up with Bob-a-loo, an innovative program that incorporates mimicry of wild animals to positively influence childhood behavior for pre-school age children, a population often overlooked.

In September, Bob-a-loo, the Dexter Farmers Market, and the Dexter District Library hosted a fun-filled activity day for over 25 families, showcasing the resources available at the library and introducing children to the vendors at the market where they purchased fresh produce from local farms. Bob-a-loo conducted follow up surveys to measure the success of the event from both a vendor and parent perspective. Vendors unanimously

agreed that they benefited from the event and had increased interaction with families and children. A grandmother had this to say, "We really enjoyed the event! My granddaughter got a kick out of purchasing her own choices at the farmers market. We went home and showed the rest of the family the animal moves we learned that day. This was a wonderful event and I hope it becomes an annual activity!"

Look for the program to run again in May of 2022 at the Chelsea District Library.






In partnership with DART Container

Western Washtenaw Recycling Authority (WWRA) was awarded two environmental improvement grants from the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE) and the Recycling Partnership.

The first grant provided \$458,370 to purchase robotic sorting equipment and a new truck to increase processing and collection capacity. The new sorting equipment doubles the capacity for sorting plastics.

Marc Williams, WWRA facility manager, said that the sorting robot has improved on its accuracy picks per minute over the past month.

"It also has the ability to sort HDPE, NAT, HDPE, MC, aluminum cans, and PET at the same time," Wil-

liams added. "Anything that is missed is picked out manually."

The second was a \$27,382 Michigan Recycling Quality Improvement grant that focuses on decreasing contamination of recyclables collected at the WWRA's eight bin sites and curbside recycling in the City of Chelsea.

Williams said that the WWRA will perform an audit to find the current contamination rate and what items are causing contamination. The grant also covers educating the public on what should not be recycled.

"After the education outreach is complete, we'll be able to conduct another audit to see if our contamination rate has been reduced."

Williams said both he and the WWRA Board are pleased to

have the opportunity to improve recycling.

"This grant allows us to continue improving our commitment to environmental sustainability while recognizing the effort in clean recycling throughout Washtenaw County," he added.

## NOVEMBER FOAM WEEKEND

THE WWRA will host a fourth Foam Recycle Weekend on November 12-14, 2021.

"After our first three successful weekends, it's clear that our communities appreciate having the opportunity to recycle #6 foam," Williams said.

The collection weekends are a partnership with DART Container, a manufacturer of food and beverage packaging items located in Mason, Michigan. Since the first event in June, over 2,500 pounds of foam have been collected.

Volunteers Bill and Glenna Jo Christen have been instrumental in the success of the project, as they were collecting foam in their garage and then transporting it to Mason for several years.

Through these efforts, Bill Christen has a keen idea of what is and is not considered #6 foam.

"For most of us, it is food containers; egg cartons; cups; packaging that comes with furniture, appliances, computers; and coolers for medicine and Omaha Steaks," said Christen.

"It is not packing peanuts, the thin, flexible foam sheeting that is used for packaging, foam wrapped in plastic or tape used in packaging, the light blue construction foam that carries the brand

name 'Styrofoam,' nor the foam that has a layered appearance and does not break or crumble."

Foam can be transported to the collection site in any container. Volunteers will assist in identifying the foam that can be recycled.

Some items that are not accepted are building insulation boards and packing peanuts. These materials can be taken to Recycle Ann Arbor on Ellsworth.

Hours for the event are Friday, Nov. 12, 11 to 5 p.m.; Saturday, Nov. 13, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sunday, Nov. 14, 11 a.m. to 3 p.m.

The foam that DART Container collects throughout Michigan is sold to other companies that make picture frames, interior molding, pens, rulers and foam packaging out of recycled foam.


