

## Interview with Patsy Stanley, Local Author and Artist

Your Book, "Christmas Stories From the Cronos Cas-

tle, features page after page of whimsical drawings, which came first, the story or the drawings? I worked

in psycho-dramatherapy for years. I would write skits for people to act out the trauma. We had kids or people with disabilities who needed parts to play, so trees and brooks became characters for people who couldn't act a part. The stories came first. I always liked to draw. When I was a kid we couldn't afford books much. I would see those beautiful Christmas books they made in the 50's. I said one day I was going to write one for myself. My twin and I were invited to a little girl's birthday party and my mom got the girl a few books. The one I was to give her was a Little Golden Book. It was Cinderel-

la. I fell in love with the book and didn't want to give it to her."

How many books have you published? "32, many are children's books. I have 2 great-grandkids and I was thinking of them when I wrote the last one."

You previously lived in Texas, what brought you back to Chelsea? "I always liked Chelsea. I was in Texas to be with my son and help with my grandson. The kids grew up. I managed to attend the Dallas Institute for Psychodrama. I moved mostly for jobs. My son is my only relative in Texas. My twin has had 6 strokes and still





The expression "Third time's the charm!" will have special meaning for the Dexter Community Orchestra and its music director, David

Schultz when the DCO presents its fall concert on Sunday, November 6 at 4:00 pm at Dexter High School's Center for the Performing Arts.

On two previous occasions, Schultz and

the DCO were scheduled to present Modest Mussorgsky's popular orchestral suite, "Pictures at an Exhibition". Both times, COVID had other ideas, and the concerts had to be canceled.

"It's been over three years since we began working on this piece," notes Schultz. "This is our third try, and this time, we're going to make it!"

The number three has added significance for the upcoming concert, as the DCO will perform Sergei Rachmaninoff's "Piano Concerto No. 3" with soloist Beth Dixon.

Both pieces are audience favorites. Those who have no more than a passing interest in classical music will probably recognize "Rach Three" from the film "Shine", for which Geoffrey Rush won the 1996 Academy Award for his portrayal of the brilliant but disturbed pianist, David Helfgott. The concerto is considered one of the most difficult in the orchestral repertoire.

"Pictures at an Exhibition" is a musical depiction of paintings and drawings by the composer's friend, Viktor Hartmann. Many of its melodies have appeared in films and TV shows, and

should be familiar to concert-goers - especially "The Great Gate of Kyiv" which concludes the piece. As an added feature, images of the artwork that inspired Mussorgsky will be projected during the performance.

Beth Dixon is a well-known pianist and instructor, who has taught in the Ann Arbor area for more than 40 years. She has studied piano at University of Michigan, Indiana University and Universitat Mozarteum of Salzburg.

During her teaching career, she has accompanied countless area high school students at Michigan School Band & Orchestra Association's solo and ensemble competitions.

People of all ages should find plenty of music to enjoy, so bring the family. As always, DCO concerts are free to the public (no ticket required). Donations to help support the costs of the orchestra will be gratefully appreciated.

# SCIO TOWNSHIP CELEBRATES LANDMARK LAND PRESERVATION PROJECT FUNDED BY ITS DEDICATED MILLAGE

On Sunday, October 16, Scio Township's Land Preservation pro-

gram celebrated its landmark conservation easement project on the Renz farm, located on the west side of Wagner Rd. south of Liberty Rd. Over 20 members of the extended Renz family attended, covering four generations. Also attending were members of Scio's Land Preservation Commission, project funders, friends and



neighbors.

Scio Supervisor Will Hathaway welcomed the crowd and expressed his delight at helping to complete a complicated project which included a conservation easement on 101.361 acres and purchase of the northern 9.5 acres for a future fire station.

Program consultant Barry Lonik noted the land had been in the Renz family for 100 years in 2020, the same year Harold "Dick" Renz passed away. Dick was born in the house on the property and lived there his entire life. In addition to farming, Dick was an Ann Arbor firefighter for 23 years. Family members shared many wonderful memories of farm work, pumpkin patches and bonfires on the land.

Lonik thanked the unprecedented five funding partners for the easement, which was purchased for just under \$3 million, the

largest amount in his 31 year career. Those sources were the federal Agricultural Conservation Easement Program (\$868,500), the State of Michigan Agricultural Preservation Fund (\$760,200), the Washtenaw County Natural Area Preservation Program (\$424,392), the City of Ann Arbor Parks and Greenbelt program (\$432,334) and Scio's dedicated land preservation millage (\$509,524).

The crowd also heard from Mike Vestergaard, a local livestock producer, who purchased the land at reduced value after the conservation easement conveyance. Mike practices rotational grazing and told of his plans to host a community garden and educational activities at the property. Mike was chosen through a public request for proposals, the first time such a process has been implemented. About 80 acres

are currently planted in hay; Vestergaard will be moving cattle in the near future. The remainder of the property is woods, treelines and farmstead.

Conservation easements are permanent deed restrictions on the use of a property. Purchasing easements costs less than buying the property, and keeps the property on the tax rolls and contributing to the local economy.

Scio Township's dedicated land preservation millage was approved by voters in 2004 and renewed in 2012, by 75% and 70% respectively. Scio's program has been involved in protecting 1,709 acres (one-third of which is publicly accessible) and leveraged over \$12 million of outside funding, with staffing cost under 6% of total expenditures. The millage is up for renewal for another ten years on the November 8 ballot.
