**Head Coach Eric Swager's comments:** On a hot day, we hosted the SEC Championship meet. There were some fine performances across the board from many of the attending schools, but Pinckney stepped up to the greatest extent and claimed the championship. We end the league season with a 4-1 dual meet record and another runner up showing. This makes the 11th straight year where we have been SEC champ or runner up - a pretty solid record.

We had 3 league champions: Parker Olk in the Pole Vault, Brandon Snyder in the long jump, and Ryan Scott in the Shot Put. Others earning all - SEC honors (top 3) were Bram Hart-suff in the 3200, Drew Shemwell in the 100, Andrew Hilbert in the 300 Hurdles, Ryan Scott in the discus, and Aiden McGuire in the discus.

We now focus our energies on this Friday's Regional Championship. We have managed to claim EIGHT straight titles, but this year will probably be our toughest challenge of them all - Five different teams have a decent shot of claiming the title. We will, of course, do our best to prepare and give our top effort to represent Chelsea.

Thanks to all the parents and volunteers who helped put on our home meets this year, and all the fans that came out on a hot day last Friday night!!!

They include Trinity Health St. Joseph Mercy Ann Arbor and Trinity Health Saint Mary's, Grand Rapids. Chelsea Hospital's joint venture partner, University of Michigan Health, also received an "A" grade.

On Friday (5/13), the Chelsea Girls Track & Field team hosted the SEC White Division Meet which included Adrian, Jackson, Pinckney, Tecumseh, and Ypsilanti Community on a warm, sunny afternoon. The meet decided the final standings for the regular season of the SEC White Division and decided All-League Honors (i.e. the top three individually and the top relays were recognized as All-League.) The final scores for the

meet were Tecumseh 153 points, Chelsea 144.5 points, Pinckney 86 points, Jackson 72 points, Adrian 46.5 points, and Ypsilanti Community 19 points. The meet outcome and the top league standings came down to the last event, the 4x400m relay, to decide the final standings. A memorable ending and definitely a solid team effort to make the meet close. The final top three in the league were Tecumseh (1st), Chelsea (2nd), and Pinckney (3rd).

Chelsea had 13 All-League Honors, 13 Personal Records (PRs), and 4 Season Bests (SBs). A summary of highlights:  
 • Ava Woodard placed 1st in the shot put (34' 5" - a PR) and 1st in the discus throw (89' 10"). All-League honors in shot put and discus throw.  
 • Anna Brant placed 3rd in the shot put (29' 6" - a PR). All-League honors in the shot put.  
 • Makayla Kegerreis placed 2nd in the long jump with

a distance of 15' 2". All-League honors in long jump.  
 • Eva Dewaele placed 3rd in the long jump with a distance of 15' 0.5" (a PR). All-League Honors in long jump.  
 • Audra Guthre placed 2nd in the pole vault with a height of 8' 0". All-League Honors in pole vault.  
 • Leila Wells placed 1st in the 100m hurdles (15.58 - a PR), placed 2nd 300m hurdles (48.51 - a PR), and placed 3rd in the 200m dash (26.68). All-

League Honors for the 100m hurdles, 300m hurdles, and the 200m dash. Leila is ranked 2nd in D2 in the 100m hurdles as of May 14th.  
 • Molly Mannor placed 2nd in the 100m hurdles (16.65) and placed 3rd in the 300m hurdles (50.64 - a PR). All-League Honors in the 100m hurdles and 300m hurdles.  
 • Paiton Doyle placed 3rd in the 800m run with a time of 2:30.93. All-League Honors in the 800m run.  
 • Julia Kause placed

3rd in the 3200m run with a time of 12:32.51. All-League Honors in the 3200m run.  
 • Laney Smith placed 5th in the 200m dash with a time of 28.56 (a PR).  
 • Natalie DeMea placed 5th in the 400m dash with a time of 65.54 (a PR).  
 • The 4x100m relay team composed of Molly Mannor, Eva Dewaele, Aleya Smith, and Leila Wells placed 2nd with a season best time of 51.98.

### Michigan Philharmonic brings 76th season to a close

A season of joyous celebration and live performances wraps up for the Michigan Philharmonic with a sold out concert at Schoolcraft College's VisTaTech Center in May. The symphony will perform the final concert of its 76th season (2021-2022) called “The Great American Songbook” on Saturday, May 21 featuring the vocal stylings of pop and jazz singer Suede. Led by Conductor and Music Director Nan Washburn, now in her 23rd season, the orchestra will perform a long litany of American classics including “Night and Day” by Cole Porter, “My Funny Valentine” by Richard Rod-

gers, “Summertime” by George Gershwin, “Send in the Clowns” by Stephen Sondheim and “Moon River” by Henry Mancini. Other featured numbers include “Fly me to the Moon” by Bart Howard, “Over the Rainbow” by Harold Arlen, and “Diamonds are a Girl's Best Friend” by Jule Styne. Patrons will also get to experience a special Duke Ellington arrangement and the “South Pacific Symphonic Scenario” (by Rodgers). The concert begins at 7:30 p.m. in the VisTaTech Center, located at 18600 Haggerty Road in Livonia. Besides her versatile vocals, the dynamic talents of Suede help her connect with the audience on a person-

al and intimate musical journey that is fun and full of legendary sounds. She returns to Michigan after tours that have included headlining world renowned clubs like New York City's Birdland and 54 Below; San Francisco's Feinstein's; Washington DC's Blues Alley and The Kennedy Center; Boston's Scullers Jazz Club; and appearing as guest vocalist with the acclaimed DIVA Jazz Orchestra on festival stages (Newport). Suede (her middle name) knew early on that she would be a full time touring musician – since age 4 when she climbed up on the piano bench and sounded out a song she liked on the radio. She was self-taught until college

where she had to have a few piano lessons in order to pass her basic skills test and be allowed to accept the

scholarship she'd been awarded by her Alma Mater, Wartburg College. She also holds the distinction of be-

ing the first and only female member of the world renowned a cappella group The Flirta-



► continued from page 1 investigators can get real evidence. I think humans are always searching for the answer to, what's next. My heart stopped for 20 minutes during open heart surgery and the most often asked question was, did I see God, or heaven or... Sadly, I did not. It was like having a deep sleep, the kind where you wake and have no idea what day or time it is. I excitedly agreed and selected the opportunity closest to my house. And was made painfully aware by friends that I'd opted to go ghost hunting on Friday the 13th, a few days ahead of a full moon and lunar eclipse. None of that stuff scares me and the idea of spirits doesn't scare me either.

Friday the 13th arrived and I drove to Eaton Rapids to tour a place called Stimpson Hospital. Our tour started at 8pm and we had the run of the property until 8am. Much to my dismay I noticed a hearse parked in front of the building. Spirits, no problem, dead bodies..YIKES. The massive ornate structure loomed forebodingly in front of me. I quickly asked myself what I was doing and why. I laughed, it was not as if I was heading to report in a war zone, instead I was able to indulge in a bucket list type adventure. I swallowed my fear and walked inside. We were provided a tour of the property from the owner with plenty of historical information. Stimpson Hospital was a community hospital that started at the end of the Spanish Flu, 1918.

It operated as a hospital until 1957. Four thousand people were born in it and 2500 died in it. Nurse Harriet Chapman along with Dr. Charlie Stimpson and Francis Blanchard started the hospital. Dr. Blanchard absentmindedly stepped into the elevator and fell 30 feet to his death in March of 1919. He landed ironically enough, in the morgue where Dr. Stimpson was working. My curiosity about the disproportionate number of births to deaths was answered by a fascinating fact. Fathers were permitted in the delivery room in Stimpson hospital even though that did not become the norm until the 1970s. It would be like having a family member in the operating room during an appendectomy, it just did not happen. But it did at Stimpson hospital and that made it a popular place to give birth. Childbirth was dangerous and the focus at Stimpson hospital was the mother, if the mother lived she could have more babies. Once babies were born they were placed in a nursery and tended to twice a day at 8am and 8pm. Nobody, not a nurse, not a family member saw or tended to the baby beyond that. This fact raised my eyebrows, nursing mothers must nurse more often than that, so I'm not sure if that's just legend.

After the tour, the group split into smaller groups. A few headed to the morgue and a few to the birthing rooms. I stayed with Amy, the founder of the team and she took the time

to show me the items she uses and explain how they work.. She's practical and warned that many items sold for the niche of ghost hunting are absurdly overpriced based on their use. She showed me a temperature gauge, of which I have one at home. The kind marketed to ghost hunters are double the price of the kind sold at auto stores. She explained the cost of motion sensors and then showed me the option she uses, a

cat ball. The groups came back from the morgue and the birthing rooms. Neither had any luck. Each was skeptical about the haunting rumors. My fear was replaced by disappointment. We decided to walk through the former ER and sit at a table and try to converse with spirit through a spirit box. Each hunter brought their own tools. One had a music box that played when touched, motion activated cat toys were placed on the

Witnessing it in real life without editing gave me a thrill. I knew Amy and her team could not be doing it. And Amy seemed to be the biggest skeptic of all. She was not easily convinced or impressed. Her criminal justice training

keeps her grounded, which is important in an investigation. I noted how easily I was excited and saw proof, maybe because I wanted proof? But Amy did not. Answers started coming through the spirit box that were undeniable, including the correct number of people in the room. We were told to get out multiple times. I, being the nosy and curious person I am, wanted to know why. Why do you want me to leave? If I had been given a good answer, I would have. But no answer was provided. The spirit box said Aimee or Amy loud and clear twice. I think all the experienced hunters expected me to freak out. But I was so thrilled I could not stop smiling. I wasn't certain if it was speaking to me . or the other Amy, the founder of the group. But it was a thrill to hear my name.
