Interview with Sue Shink Democrat for Michigan's New 14th Senate District

Normally when I interview candidates, I don't have a horse in the race. I am in a different district, for schools, mayor, city council and most elected officials. But with redistricting, I will be voting in this particular election. I've interviewed the two candidates I've previously met. If you are a candidate and would like to be interviewed, please reach out via email. I'm happy to do it. Campaigning is a little easier since the last election, I don't feel so pressured to be covering every candidate. With the world shut down, the importance of the local paper became very clear. I needed to do the leg work because candidates and voters had limited options. If you are a candidate, I'm happy

to learn more and am available to chat.

I had the pleasure of interviewing Sue Shink a Democratic candidate for Michigan's 14th Senate District. I don't know Sue on a social level, but I've gotten to know her and her work through the Dexter Forum. When I called for the interview, she provided the usual niceties, "How are you?" My response was, "eh."

She jumped in as if on cue, "What's the matter, the state of Democracy, reproductive rights, climate change, and worker rights? That's why I'm running."

I responded, "Yes to all of that and you just answered my first question." In my mind the list is daunting, scary and depressing but Sue speaks from a place of confidence and optimism. The to-do list seems long and impos-

sible but Sue approaches it like an Olympic athlete that already has a few gold medals around her neck. I can hear her smile as she speaks. Her optimism and confidence makes sense given her background. She served as County Commissioner Chair during the pandemic, a trial by fire, to which she rose to the challenge. I did not envy a single elected official serving the public during that difficult time.

I wondered what Sue's qualifications were for serving in the position. Sue explained that her most important qualification is that she cares about people and working with them to solve challenges. Sue is also a lawyer with a masters in Resource Policy Analysis. Her website lists the University of Michigan as the school from which she

received her education and gives gratitude to the need-based scholarships and financial aid which allowed her to obtain her education. Sue was not born with a silver spoon and has had to work for everything she has. Sue also has experience serving her community. She spent 4 years as trustee, 3 as County commissioner and served as chair during the pandemic.

I asked Sue what she hopes to accomplish in the position. Sue stated that she hopes there will be a senate majority and then we will be able to pass laws that protect civil rights, specifically the right to be free of discrimination, reproductive rights, voting rights, worker protections, policies to protect clean air, water, land, to reduce carbon emissions in a fair and just manner. Sue would like

to pass laws that create more opportunities for Michiganders to get ahead and live the lives they want to live; education, innovation, physical and mental health... So many things we need to do better; childcare and infrastructure. Just listening to all the work that needs to be done, has this reporter stressed! But faces the work with the confidence of a person who knows she can succeed.

As we chatted, I noted that in the forum, Sue had earned the respect of those on both sides of the aisle. Catherin McClary and Sue Shink have successfully pleased constituents, no matter party identity. Sue explained, "My fundamental belief is in every person who lives here and my desire to work with people and make things better. I love serving our community. A lot of needs

people have in common regardless of vote a lot we can achieve in common. I can figure out how to build those bridges. The need is to take action and Republicans refuse to take action."

The final question I asked Sue was, "If there was anything else her constituents should know." "The primary process is an interview for a position. What we've done in the past is a good indication of our future; I've invested in parks, ensured access to vaccines and testing, supported seniors, human services, and preserved farms. If your farm land was saved from development, I probably had something to do with it. I want to work with community members to improve quality of life and continue to serve."
