Bestmaze Corn Maze FINAL SEASON -

A cross state gas pipeline project will put an end to Mid Michigan's favorite corn maze.

After 22 years of operation along I-96 in Williamston, Bestmaze will cease to exist after this season. A \$550 million pipeline project going from Chelsea to Ovid will cross the farm in 2023 and take out the maze's parking lot. A 14 feet wide by 8 feet deep trench will cut a mile long gash through the owners farm to install the new 36" diameter pipe and make operation of maze impractical for 2023 and 2024. So this is your last chance to conquer a favorite fall activity of Mid-Michigan. Opening the 2022 season on Friday Sept. 16 the maze will run until Oct. 30. The mazes ticket booth will be open Friday night's 6-10 pm, Saturday 1-10pm and Sundays 1-8pm. New this year will be an onsite app to track your progress via your phone. A "fog" will cover the map and disappear as you walk down the paths revealing where you have been but not

the paths ahead of you. Bestmaze opened in 2001 with a Great Lakes Theme carving a lighthouse, freighter, and hot air balloon into the maze. Other years they carved themes of space, dinosaurs, Smokey Bear turning 75, Cruise ships, knights and dragons, The Wild West, King Tut, Pirates, Under the Sea, and more. For the final maze theme Bestmaze is going out with a roar, VIKINGS! People will enter the maze and enter the Viking Longship, then off through the maze to find Odin's Raven, the Viking with his sword and shield. Then into the three triangles and Thor's Hammer before exiting. Customers told the owners to change their name to Bestmaze during the first year of operation. The maze won several public "favorites" voting events for mazes over the years. Bestmaze is unique because they have underground drainage and also hand rake all the trails to shed water. Even after a heavy rain the trails are not muddy

while other mazes are a mud bog. The maze is designed and installed by the owner; not hired out to an out of state company that cuts mazes all over the nation. Upon news spreading on Facebook of the last season, past guests are already sending messages of sorrow to hear the maze will end. Bestmaze has been a fall tradition for families as well as a surprising number of first dates. The maze has also been the scene of a few marriage proposals, family reunions, office parties, birthday parties, youth groups and college events. Many say they are making a special effort to attend this year for one last tour through their favorite corn maze. Customers are encouraged to see www.bestmaze.com for more info. A new food truck will be onsite and all food truck profits will fund the truck to become a traveling soup kitchen for areas hungry this winter.





This support group meets on Thursdays from 10:30 a.m. to noon beginning September 22, 2022.



ready to launch an expanded version. Until this year, MOPS was exclusively for women with children 1st grade and younger. But this year the decision to expand to mothers with children under 18. If your children are grown but you're looking for companionship, MOPS will gladly take mentor moms. Your experience can be valuable to newer moms, needing help, support, and friendship.

MOPS started as a small group of moms with preschool-aged children in 1973. The mothers met for two hours while their children had childcare. They ate, crafted, and ended with a devotional. Over the past 50 years, the organization has continued to grow and evolve. It is a worldwide organization with locations in Chelsea and throughout Michigan. There is a religious aspect, but members can be from all religious backgrounds. Everyone is welcome although MOPS is a Christian or-

ganization. It is an excellent opportunity to break the isolation that being a mother to very young children can bring. It is a relief to be around people who understand and relate to your child slapping other kids and screaming in frustration. I joined Chelsea MOPS because I was worried my daughter wasn't getting the social education she might have gotten from preschool because I was home with her. She loved meeting new friends and I found, I enjoyed the new friends and community, myself. Even if you, like me, don't see yourself joining groups, this became an important part of my life to which I am forever grateful. Young mom, old mom, Christian mom, Muslim mom, single mom, married, divorced, or otherwise, just bring your child and meet other women who get it.

The expanded version of Chelsea MOPS is MOMSnext. According to the MOPS website, "The purpose of MOPS and MOMSnext

is to encourage women in their role as moms from conception to adulthood." When my son and his girlfriend found out they were going to be young parents, the MOPS group stepped up to support them. There was no judgment, just women offering to help with whatever the young parents needed. The opposite of sanctimonious, they were kind, generous, and tried to help. I was a young mom with my oldest son and I wasn't always received with kindness and lack of judgment so I really appreciated their support and kindness. My experience with Chelsea Mops has been that they aspire to the mission statement and are compassionate, kind, and support moms. Chelsea District Library (CDL) kicked off its fundraising campaign on June 10 to help fund Mobile CDL, an outreach vehicle that will be added to CDL services in 2023. The Bee a Part of It campaign was conceived

after receiving many generous gifts made in memory of long-time library supporter, board member, Friend, and bookkeeper Mary Budzinski—affectionately known as Mary B. The campaign goal was set at \$25,000 and closed on September 15 having reached over \$61,000

in pledges and donations.

Director Lori Co-reyell shares, "We are overwhelmed by the outpouring of generosity throughout this campaign! Every donation, no matter the size, adds up and supports our efforts to improve access to library staff, resources, and services throughout the community through Mobile CDL.
