## Restaurant Review: Aubree's Pizzeria & Grill

I've been touring the restaurants in Dexter during the pandemic hoping to help support local businesses. I realized that I've not yet visited Aubree's. I've dined at Aubree's in the past so that might be why. But, it is not my intention to skip any restaurants and today, my daughter and I decided to enjoy lunch together by ordering Aubree's.

We checked out the online menu. Since I already know Aubree's has great pizza, I decided to try something different this time. I browsed the lunch deals but opted to check out the limited time offer menu. The first thing on that menu caught my eye, the herb cheese spread. Then I noticed The Nashville hot chicken sandwich. My daughter, who is six, really

appreciated the children's menu. There is a good selection of child approved main dishes as well as choices of sides. My daughter opted for a cheese pizza and struggled to choose between fries, a Go-Gurt, peaches, or apple slices. Ultimately, she went with fries. I noticed an order online option. It was very easy to navigate and allows the person ordering to select a pick-up time. This is very convenient for ordering at a business or ordering around a busy schedule. Obviously, selecting a time will only work for ordering in advance because food takes time to prepare. But, it worked well for me and allowed me to schedule the food and give myself time to drive and warm up my car. I really appreciate the ease of the website

and the ordering online option. I set the pick-up time for 2pm and hoped it would be ready without issue.

We arrived on time and were immediately greeted as we walked in the door. We were directed around toward the back left side where there was a window to get pick-up orders. Ours was ready as we arrived. The timing was perfect and my six-year-old was happy to not have to wait and be patient while the food cooked.

We grabbed our food and got in the car. My daughter could smell the food and started asking to eat. I handed her a slice of pizza. "That's good pizza," she stated right after her first bite. She's only six but she's a bit of a pizza expert. It's her favorite food and Lord **continued on page 4**

# St. Joseph Mercy Chelsea receives COVID-19 vaccine, administers first vaccinations

On December 23, St. Joseph Mercy Chelsea received and administered its first shipment of the FDA-approved Moderna COVID-19 vaccine.

The hospital received 1,700 doses, joining six other Trinity Health Michigan hospitals that have begun administering COVID-19 vaccines to front line workers.

The vaccines are being administered on a voluntary basis to health care personnel who meet the CDC-defined criteria of direct patient care to COVID-19 patients, including those working on the COVID units, Intensive Care Unit, and Emergency Department. Employees who work in those departments are being given the opportunity to self-register and

make an appointment to obtain the vaccine.

"Today marks a historic moment for our hospital and our community," said Dr. Alon Weizer, chief medical officer at St. Joseph Mercy Chelsea. "Our team has worked tirelessly for the past year to care for patients, our community and each other. To have the vaccine arrive days before Christmas is a welcome gift for all of us, and represents an important step to bringing this pandemic under control."

Trinity Health Michigan hospitals throughout the state expect to continue to receive weekly shipments of both the Pfizer and the Moderna mRNA-1273 vaccine. Across Trinity Health Michigan, Mercy Health Grand Rapids, Mercy Health Muskegon, St. Joseph Mercy Ann Arbor, St. Joseph Mercy Livingston, St. Joseph Mercy Oakland and St. Mary Mercy Livonia have all received their first vaccine shipments. All

the hospitals have ultra-cold freezers and are prepared to receive, store and distribute vaccines over the coming months.

People who are vaccinated must stay committed to the recommended safety guidelines. It is crucial to remain vigilant - avoid crowds, continue physical distancing, wear masks and continue excellent hand hygiene.

St. Joseph Mercy Chelsea looks forward to offering vaccinations to community members, which it hopes to do in the coming weeks as it works through the CDC and state directed priority list. Information regarding the ability to schedule community members for the COVID-19 vaccination will be provided as soon as it becomes available.  er how the luminaries are normally distributed and how they were done this year to keep everyone safe. Justin stated, "The team that stepped up to keep the tradition alive this year is the same team that has coordinated the creation and distribution of the Luminaries over the last several years."

Justin discussed the families involved, "The Augustine family, the Covert family, and the McKillen family." He added that the city would like to offer a special thank you to Erin McKillen, Kurt and Al Augustine, and Tom and Kim Covert. "This year they worked especially hard to make sure that the process of distributing the Luminaries was as safe as possible so that the tradition could continue."

In previous years, the team created each household a luminary kit and community groups like the Lions

Club and Boy Scouts would pick up the kits and distribute, usually it was done with multiple people in the cars. This year, to continue the tradition things had to be different. Individuals or households stepped up to be street captains and were in charge of handling the assembly and distribution of the kits. A street captain visited the Department of Public Works and the kits were loaded into their cars, in drive through fashion. The street captain assembled and delivered them to individual homes.

I had the opportunity to visit and see the Luminaries on Christmas Eve. There is always something beautiful about seeing them. But this year, it was a little extra beautiful to me. It was a little emotional to see some things continue, though so much has changed, a bit of hope and relief that the things we love and cherish will be back and not lost. Thank you to the families that worked so hard to keep the tradition alive and thank you to all the street captains that jumped in and helped.


Students at St. Mary Pinckney presented a beautiful nativity and light show in lieu of their annual Christmas concert.


Dexter and Chelsea both have female swimmers who have

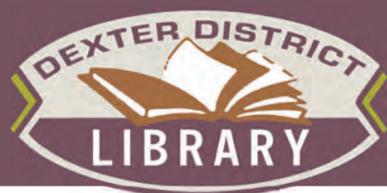
to finish the swimming season at the state meet later in January.
