

following changes impacting participating artists:

- Participating artists will check-in and paint on their own as normal within the Dexter School District boundaries between August 17th and Aug 21st.

- We are eliminating registration fees associated with the 2020 event. If you have already registered and paid, you will receive a refund whether you choose to attend or not.

- Registration deadlines have been extended to July 1st for all artists.

- Because prizes usually come from corporate sponsorships, and local sponsorships are currently unavailable, we are unable to award any prizes this year, and no judging will take place. There will not be a separation of professional and amateur categories.

- There will be no in-person Festival Tent, exhibit or public reception. Instead, an online exhibit will open at the end of the event for artists to sell their paintings to the general public.

- Artists will be asked to submit photos of their paintings within 2 days of the conclusion of the event. Artists will take their paintings home with them.

- All parameters for artwork as described in the Artist Guide on our website will apply.

- This exhibit will be open for at least one month, but may be open through the end of 2020.

- All works submitted will be available for purchase, and artists are expected to include shipping costs in their price.

- Paintings produced at previous Paint Dexter Plein Air Festivals that have not sold

may also be submitted for sale.

- A standard 30% commission on artwork will apply.

- We will not be able to host the Tuesday Artists Reception.

- We will ask artists to maintain social distancing guidelines, and wear masks when unable to maintain at least 6' separation from other artists and area residents.

- If you are an artist that previously registered for the Festival and would like to withdraw, please contact us.

The following changes will impact Festival Patrons:

- We will not be hosting an adult workshop or children's event, but we are hoping to do something unique separately and at a later date. Any fees paid for these events will be refunded.

- The painting sale will take place in an online format.



COVID-19 Closure FAQ & Resources

Library Now Fully Closed through June 12

- Just ahead of the Memorial Day weekend, Governor Whitmer issued a new Executive Order (EO 2020-96) which extended statewide 'Stay Home, Stay Safe' orders through June 12. In issuing this order ahead of the Memorial Day weekend, the Governor did relax some restrictions on areas in northern Michigan and for certain types of businesses. However, the order continues prohibitions on providing all but critical, government in-person services (Section VII.) This even applies to areas of the State which have seen relaxation of commerce. Unfortunately, the order precludes the Library for providing any direct, in-person services. According to the State's MI Safe Start Plan, Michigan has been divided into eight regions, which will be monitored for COVID-19 progression. Washtenaw County falls into Region 1, along with the counties of Genesee, Lapeer, Livingston, Oakland, Macomb, Monroe, Saint Clair and Wayne counties. Due to the prevalence of COVID-19 cases in Wayne County, it is expected that our region will see restrictions on movement and service continue to be tighter than other regions of the State. The Library continues to prepare a reopening plan to ensure that when restrictions are lifted, we will be able to resume lending materials in a manner that is safe for both our staff and the general public.
- On May 7, 2020, Governor Whitmer extended the statewide "Stay Home" order by issuing Executive Order 2020-77. This order continues closure of public libraries through May 28 and provides more consistency with previous Executive Orders (see below.) With the current order, the Library is not allowed to bring staff back into the Library to prepare to restore services. As we move forward through this crisis, we continue to monitor our options. The Library's drop boxes remain closed and we still cannot accept donations of materials. We continue to work with the staff at our library cooperative (The Library Network) to adjust due dates for items previously borrowed as well as extend borrower card expiration dates. Rest assured, no fines will accrue for the duration of this crisis. The Library will follow the State's MI Safe Start Plan and restore some form of in-person services when possible. We continue to expand our digital services and have increased borrowing limits for our hoopla and Kanopy services. If you do not have a Dexter District Library borrower's card, our online application process is quick, easy and can get you started borrowing materials while sheltering. On behalf of the staff and Board, we hope you and your family remain healthy and well.
- On April 24, Governor Whitmer extended the 'Stay Home' order with Executive Order 2020-59, which allowed some restoration of business activities. While there was a curbside service caveat for some businesses, the order was reviewed by the Library's attorney along with the Library of Michigan legal staff. Their interpretation of the order was that Section 6, outlining limitations on governmental activities, precluded resumption of any in-person service by public libraries to the general public. This requires our current posture of being closed to the public and relying on digital services to continue through May 15. We continue to prepare for the time when we can resume services. While we do not know for certain what form that will take, the Library is developing several scenarios to adapt to environmental conditions and provide a safe experience for the public as well as safe working conditions for our staff. Please continue to monitor our website for new information as it becomes available.
- If you returned any Library items between Friday, 3/13/2020 and early Wednesday AM, 3/18/2020 – those items have been placed in a quarantine and will continue to show on your account until they've been checked back in.
 - These same items may be showing as overdue, lost or as fines on your account. You will not be fined for any items returned during this period. All of the fines will be erased when the items get checked in.
 - Our outdoor return boxes are now locked. Please keep all materials at home for the time being. No overdue fines will be assessed during this period.
 - All library cards that had recently expired or were going to expire soon have had expiration dates extended.
 - Don't have a library card? Click here to apply for one.
 - Online registration is only available to residents of the Dexter School District. If you reside outside our service area, please check with your home library about getting a card.
 - The Wi-Fi signal at the Library is available 24/7. Most devices get a strong signal in our parking lot and (when the weather is nice) for the benches along Alpine Street as well as the terrace area in Mill Creek Park North.

ee and member of the Teamsters and the daughter of a custodian. She discussed losing her mother during COVID-19 to pancreatic cancer and how lucky she was to be able to see her mother prior to her passing. Thankfully, her sister is a nurse and was able to care for their ailing mother. While losing a mother cannot be easy, I discussed watching a family friend battle COVID and how he's not been able to see his family in person in eight weeks and what a blessing that she was able to say goodbye.

Amy did explain that she worked with Fire Chief through Washtenaw 100, of which she is the Vice President of the Board. Washtenaw 100 is an organization that aims to provide immediate financial support to families of law enforcement and firefighters serving in Washtenaw County who die in the line of duty. It also provides college scholarships to children of active duty law enforcement and firefighters as

well as grants to local law enforcement and fire departments.

My next question for her was why? Why did she decide to run? Amy has been working as an assistant prosecutor in Washtenaw County for 17 years. She stated she works every day in court and would like to continue to serve. "As a judge, I can do that." Amy reflected on her first job in a law firm, where she worked with women in shelters with a focus on custody and divorce. Many were victims of domestic violence. "These women need a voice." If elected to judge she can continue to serve the community and families she's dealing with going through trauma. Her experience speaks for itself and rather than list everything, I encourage you to visit her website and browse her endorsements and experience.

The one thing her website cannot do is convey the deep empathy I heard in her voice. Even as a woman grieving her mother, she had empathy for my fam-

ily friend battling COVID-19. We discussed how she was managing her cases now through Zoom mostly. But she spoke of a young victim that she opted to meet in person because the child is already dealing with trauma and she felt that Zoom was not appropriate for the needs of the child. I could hear in her voice, the amount she cared. Her first two years as judge will be focused on family law as well as PPOs and PPO violations, and I think her experience speaks for itself in the matter. I imagine going through a divorce is traumatic to the family and having someone with a lot of compassion and experience on the bench will be an asset to everyone involved.

I asked her how she is adjusting her campaign under COVID-19? Being unable to attend events or knock on doors is a challenge. She is shifting to campaigning on social media. She's meeting people online. You can connect with her on her Facebook page, Amy Reiser For

Judge. There is a send email button, which is how I was able to set up an interview. She was quick to respond back and readily available. I am certain if you want to learn more about her or have questions or concerns, she'd be happy to get to know you. On June 4th at 6:30pm Amy will be hosting a candidate conversation and virtual fundraiser. To register for the event, visit AmyReiser.com or email info@amyreiser.com. She says she's missing the human interaction but that she is adjusting to the new style of campaigning.

Amy also discussed her philosophy as a judge is to treat people with dignity and respect. Everyone has a story and a background. "I do that now as a voice for victims." She tries to figure out where the defendant is coming from. "I'm one of the prosecutors, but I look for mental health and sobriety options, if possible options. Sometimes, it's not an option."

I finished the interview with a new

question submitted by my son. His questions are unique and tend to catch the candidate by surprise, which I am certain the job will do as well. I enjoy observing the reaction and how they respond after being caught a bit off guard. "If there was one aspect of the criminal justice system you could change, what would it be and why?" Amy acknowledged the question was not what she was expecting or used to. But her career as an assistant prosecutor seems to have prepared her well for the question. She actually gave two answers. They both impressed me, so I am going to write them both. The voice for the victim shined through with her first answer. She stated she would make the system a little easier for victims to navigate. "Crime is traumatic. Victims are thrown into a system they've never been in before. It should be easier for victims." Amy Reiser went on to describe a simple example. When a victim is called in for a victim impact state-

ment, they should go first and not be forced to wait through other cases. "We should not lose sight of the fact that lives have been disrupted."

Amy then added something that surprised me a bit, given her role as a prosecutor. She added that she'd like to see more treatment court options like sobriety court and mental health court. The gist of what she conveyed was that when the root cause of the crime is addressed and resolved, society wins, the criminal has the chance to change and a positive outcome for the future is available. One number, 734-544-3050, should be added to address books all across the county. It's the CARES access number for mental health and substance use treatment services offered by Washtenaw County Community Mental Health.

The number may be needed at 3:00 a.m on a Monday, during kickoff on Homecoming weekend, or 6:00 p.m. on a Sunday. In fact, twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week, 365 days a year--the phones at Washtenaw County Community Mental Health are staffed and CARES social workers, therapists, peer-specialists, and psychiatrists are on standby to offer Crisis response services, Access to mental health services, Resource connections, Engagement with community partners, and Support for individual needs.

Middle and high school teachers should have kids take out their phones and program it in during math class. Anyone who's lost a loved one, struggled with addiction, or experienced mental health challenges and had difficulty finding help should post it on the fridge right now.

These staff aren't exclusively for residents with severe needs or critical emergencies; they're for everyone, in every one of the county's townships. That wasn't always the case.

Washtenaw County Community Mental Health, like community mental health agencies all across the state, has been contending with major state funding reductions that don't even come close to covering the cost of mandated services.

Jackson County passed a similar millage in the spring of 2017 and opened a Crisis R&R facility just 15 months later. The living room-style facility is open five days a week for anyone in crisis and staff are there to welcome guests on arrival and connect them to a broad range of resources including counseling, housing, food, and more"

For several years, those cuts led to diminished services, but, thanks to the eight-year Public Safety and Mental Health Millage which was passed by Washtenaw County voters last fall by a two to one margin, Washtenaw County Community Mental Health administrators began to extend services to more residents, all across the county.

As we write this, only eight months since Washtenaw County millage dollars first became available, the list of services is long and growing. And, the list of success stories is following suit.

Residents have been referred to community psychologists for short-term counseling to contend with a loss. They've been able to access enough prescribed medicines to cover until they could get to see their doctors. They've gotten same-day appointments with behavioral health specialists and primary care providers; help filling out insurance, housing, and food applications; advice from peers with lived experience; and rides to necessary appointments. In sum, we provide dozens of different support services at little or no cost to clients.

"Millage-funded staff expansions have allowed Washtenaw County Community Mental Health to respond to 800 more crisis service requests in the first six months of 2019--from January to June--than the agency did during the same time frame last year, and we've received 250 referrals in a two month period for other services," says Program Administrator Melisa Tasker. "It's been such an honor to speak with and serve residents all across the county and we're looking forward to announcing many more program and system improvements in the years ahead."

Where do Washtenaw County residents go to get these services? To Ypsilanti and Ann Arbor, of course, but also to rural sites across the county.

Through agreements with local organizations Washtenaw County Community Mental Health administrators are placing staff at external facilities with no cost to taxpayers. Residents are now getting free and low-cost assistance for mental health and substance use needs in Chelsea and Dexter. Soon, residents will be able to meet with community mental health staff in Manchester and Whitmore Lake as well.

According to Chelsea Police Chief Ed Toth, "Thirty years ago, you might deal with a mental health crisis a few times a year. Now it's a weekly situation. We're a small agency here, usually a couple of people covering a shift and that's all. But every time I've called the CARES hotline, the response team has been super for us."



Washtenaw County Health Department Rescinds Local Emergency Orders *Employee screening is now required under Michigan Executive Orders*

Washtenaw County Health Department is rescinding local emergency orders requiring COVID-19 screening, social distancing, face coverings and additional public health strategies to protect everyone's health to the greatest degree possible as now covered in Michigan Executive Orders and under guidance provided by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

Significant changes include eliminating requirements to self-quarantine after domestic travel for most workers. Executive Order 2020-71, however, maintains specific requirements for food workers and pharmacy employees; they must self-quarantine at home for 14 days following travel outside of Michigan. Other types of employees who have travelled but may continue working should wear a mask at work for

14 days following the travel.

Washtenaw County Health Department has prepared a COVID-19 Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) for Workplaces document to address questions and a workplace sample health screening form to guide screening procedures. As before, owners, operators and service providers may direct additional or urgent questions to 734-544-6700 or l-wchdcontact@washtenaw.org. If calling, please leave a message as most calls are returned remotely.

The Health Department will continue to use CDC guidance to provide appropriate instructions for isolation or quarantine when individuals are diagnosed with COVID-19 or have close, personal contact with a confirmed case.

Oakland and Ingham County Health Departments are joining Washtenaw Coun-

ty in rescinding similar orders today.



Have you ever heard of or tried rolled ice cream? I think I saw it once on an Anthony Bourdain show. But once I started reviewing restaurants, I realized Dexter has a rolled ice cream place. I put it on my list to visit once the weather warmed a bit. But COVID-19 hit and I

was not sure I'd get the chance anytime soon. Thankfully, I saw that they had reopened announced on their Facebook page. As the weather warmed, I put a visit on my to do list. Last week was just the week.

I took a tour of Naughty Boy's website and learned the idea for rolled ice cream came from the own-

er's honeymoon to Thailand. The owner of Naughty Boy's tried rolled ice cream from a street cart on vacation. The name Naughty Boy pays homage to the trip as well. While in Thailand they visited an elephant sanctuary and were able to watch a six month old rescued elephant nicknamed "naughty boy." The website explains, "Our nod to Naughty Boy is a reminder to us to enjoy every day, and to keep on rollin."

Naughty Boy's is open 2-8pm Tuesday-Sunday. You order online and receive curbside pickup. Since I have a bit of a drive, I waited to order until I arrived. My phone does not get wifi service in the parking lot. So I ended up having to call and place my order. If you're in Dexter, you might want to

order prior to leaving, just in case you can't do it online.

I selected Chunky Trunk from the classics menu. This treat included Reese's peanut butter cup, nutella caramel drizzle and whipped cream. I ordered my daughter a mini boy with strawberry rainbow sprinkles and whipped cream.

Two girls in masks approached my car. I wore my mask, to try and make them safer. They stayed back as far as possible to hand me my treats. They were both incredibly polite and even in the distance required by COVID, they gave every effort to be warm and provide wonderful customer service. It's been a long time since I've interacted with anyone outside my home. So their



kindness was a real pleasure. My daughter, who was having a rough week saw pink ice cream and sprinkles and was overjoyed. These types of treats and outings have been so limited during COVID, you'd think I took her to Disney.

The ice cream tasted fresh, so fresh, I could taste cream and sugar. I don't think I've ever had ice cream that tasted this real. My daughter loved it as she ate it in her car seat on the way home. She repeatedly talked about how good it was. I had to agree. Upon my arrival home, I decided to do more research. I noticed on the website, what seemed to answer the difference in taste.

The website states: "Our ice cream is prepared fresh, right in front of you. We take fresh dairy mix and add fruit, chocolate


